## History

On Friday evening, October 16, 1885 approximately fifty gentlemen met at the Hotel Vendome in the interest in the formation of a new social club, to be located in the Back Bay district. Those present agreed to associate themselves together and organize a new club to be named "The Algonquin Club."

"The Algonquin Club of Boston" was incorporated by a special act of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for the purpose of maintaining a Club House and Reading Room in the city of Boston on March 9, 1886. And by April of that same year, land at 217 Commonwealth Avenue was purchased for the erection of an appropriate permanent club house. Messrs. McKim, Mead & White of New York were selected as the architects based on their submission of the winning plans – under the code name "Vogue La Galini" - in a blind completion of the then-leading practitioners in their field. In due course, a building contract was awarded to one of the most prominent and important construction companies of the nineteenth century and construction was soon underway.

Today, our members and guests are transported into a different time as they enter our historic Clubhouse. Our grand rooms, such as the Reading Room and Main Dining Room, preserve the fixtures and furnishings put in place by our founders in 1888. The incredible Reading Room preserves Victorian fashion, with its spendid hand-painted wallpaper, molded plaster, and original Davenport furnishings, while the Main Dining Room's impressive pewter chandelier enchants diners as they look out onto views of the Back Bay.
